TREASURER REPORT-APRIL, BUDGET FY 2026, NEW MEMBERS

\$549 Activity (service) \$2,535 Administration. Dues covering the period from July-Dec. 2025 will be payable July 1. This fiscal year ACLC has added NINE new members. SPECTRIOS PROGRAM AT MAY MEETING

Dr. Tracy Williams from SPECTRIOS INSTITUTE (beneficiary of the Super Bowl Fund Raiser) & a 40+ year Lion Member covered the role of the Low Vision Clinic and a variety of eye issues. He discussed his training experiences, including those in New York and his association with the Wheaton



Eye Clinic. The Low Vision Clinic has provided services to 25,000 participants. Spectrios Institute began in 1986 and is designed to see 5 patients daily for one hour. Other items discussed included cataract surgery, retinal detachment, macular degeneration, optic nerve damage, corneas, and glasses incorporating artificial intelligence. Dr. Williams is also on the staff

at Loyola and has been a team doctor for the Chicago White Sox and Chicago Bulls.

CLUB EVALUATION FOR 2024-25

The ACLC Board received 36 survey evaluations. The evaluation showed strong support for the current service projects. The majority favored having 2-3 programs per year at the meetings and 2 tour opportunities. On the issue of a Club meeting at a restaurant, 21 were in favor and 15 were opposed. Members reported the usefulness of the ACLC website, the ACLC Newsletter, the Lion Page in the Carillon Newsletter, the new member packet, and the visits by our District Governor and Zone Chair. The ACLC Board and the Membership Committee will review the results in upcoming meetings.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR NEXT FISCAL YEAR

The ACLC Membership Committee provided 5 recommendations to the ACLC Board. They were like last year's. These included 1) keeping dues/entrance fees the same as this year, 2) growing membership by +3 (ACLC board amended to +2), adding one more service project in the new fiscal year, 4) continuing Minute for Membership Quarterly, & 5) having one community program. The State convention had 215 attendees representing the 10 Districts. The keynote speaker was Past International President Gudrun Yngvadottir. This was her second time at the Illinois Lions Convention. Other speakers included the DEAF NINJA Kyle Schulze. Born deaf, Kyle is now a Mechatronics Engineer and provides training at the Summer Illinois Lions Camps. A third speaker was Brian Bussard, who lost his sight suddenly in 2016. He enrolled in the Colorado Center for the Blind graduating in Oct. 2018. Brian is now Lions President for the Baugo Township Lions (Indiana). A seminar was



presented by Ron Reibschelger (Rockford, MI) on Mission Possible by reaching 1.5 million Lions Members by using lionsvirtual.org. Next year the

State Convention will be in Bloomington, Illinois Lion Districts 1A and 1BK are among the US leaders in membership growth. Both border District 1J.
