The **November FMSC** packing involved 7 **Lions** and 1 **Community Member.** On that day, **ACLC** helped pack 143 boxes which made 30,888 meals, feeding **85 children** for a year. The value of the packing was \$7,413. In **December, 7** Lions packed 159 boxes making 34,344 meals, and feeding 94 children for the year. #### TOUR OF NORTHERN ILLINOIS FOOD BANK & LUNCH AT PAL JOEY'S

On Nov. 8, ACLC toured the Northern Illinois Food Bank which provides services to 13 northern



Illinois counties going from the Wisconsin border to Kankakee. The Club learned that NIFB is only 1 of 6 Feeding America sites that can process its own meat under USDA approval. NIFB uses 17,000 volunteers not only at the Geneva site but also in Lake Forest, Joliet, and Rockford. NIFB in Kane County serves 900+ food pantries, soup kitchens, and feeding programs providing 10.3 million meals. Ten Aurora Elementary **Schools** participate in this program. Examples of direct services include mobile markets, senior programs, SNAP Outreach, Community Markets, Holiday Meal boxes, and

Milk2MyPlate. **ACLC** then approved **\$250** to go to **Northern Illinois Food Bank**, <u>(see picture on last page)</u>. Following the tour, the Club held a short business meeting and had lunch at **Pal Joey's** (Batavia) Karen McCann host

## **INTERNATIONAL NEWS**

Lions International reported that in 2021-22, 495 million people worldwide were helped by Lions through 1.4 million service activities. ACLC helped contribute to that service through Campaign 100 and our own local service projects. Lions International & the Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF) have been active in Ukraine and Poland helping the refugees through shelters, food, clothing, and mental health. This help also includes immediate survival needs, transitional needs for mid-long term settlement, and support to help integration into the new communities.

He also worked at the Pentagon and with Naval forces in the Mediterranean. After military retirement, he was a pilot with United Airlines. **Three ACLC** members attended.

## **AURORA HISTORICAL SITES**

Across from City Hall one can view and visit the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) Military Museum. The GAR was made up of returning veterans from the Civil War. More than 1,200 soldiers in Aurora regiments were killed or wounded in that War. Survivors then formed Post 20 and had a Memorial Hall built in 1876 (July 4). The land was donated by Joseph Stolp. The Hall has had many purposes-a meeting location for Civil War veterans, later a public library, and now a museum that serves as a meeting place for current veterans. The City took over the Hall in the



1960's as the volunteer organization could no longer maintain it. In 2001 the GAR building was closed



for repairs. It **reopened in 2016**. The Military Museum has won **Awards in 2016, 2017, 2020, 2021, and 2022** for historic restoration, small institution of the year, top museum in Kane County, top museum of the Fox River Valley, and for its exhibit **on SERVICES AND SACRIFICE 100 YEARS OF AURORA'S MILITARY EXCELLENCE**. The **GAR Military Museum** is open for visitors TH-FRI (Noon-4pm) and SAT (10AM-3PM). The Museum also provides summer camps, educational programs, and temporary exhibits.
