INTERNATIONAL LIONS NEWS

At the December ACLC meeting, Club members raised \$100 for Campaign 100 which is the biggest LCIF drive for humanitarian grant needs dealing with disasters, hunger, health (vision, childhood cancer, measles vaccinations, diabetes) and environmental issues. The funds raised by ACLC will support any of these types of programs- 2 cataract surgeries, aid to 4 disaster relief victims, food for 14 chronically hungry people, clean water for 14 people, testing for 8 young cancer patients, diabetes screening for 18 people, and measles vaccinations for 100 children.
